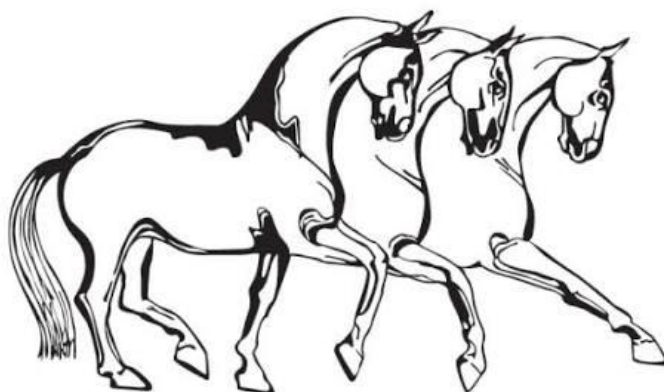

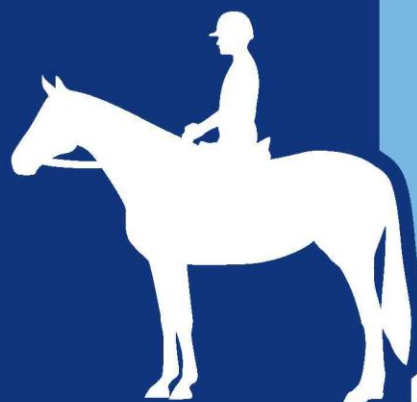

PAPER ENTRIES WILL BE RETURNED TO SENDER. <u>DO NOT E-MAIL/MAIL ANYTHING TO DEVONWOOD.</u> If scheduling allows, late entries will only be accepted online. Please contact the show secretary as soon as possible regarding late entries. Late entries (received after closing date) will be assessed a late fee.
Levels:	USDF Sport Horse breeding classes, along with USDF Materiale classes.

Entries:	Online Entries <u>ONLY</u> at https://entry.foxvillage.com/ Accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. One entry per horse/rider combination. Completed entries (signature pages, copies of all association cards, and a copy of a current coggins within 12 months of show date (with horse's show name – per USEF rule GR906.4) and a copy of horse's vaccination records within 6 months of show date (per USEF rule GR845)) must be with entry or be emailed to the competition secretary at dressageshowsec@aol.com or a \$25.00 incomplete entry fee will be charged. All competitors enter the show with this understanding and agreement. Email entries to dressageshowsec@aol.com; emailed entries will only be accepted with a credit card and an \$10 additional fee.
Awards:	Divisions (Junior/Young, Adult Amateur, Open) will be run concurrently as one class and pinned together. Handlers/Riders must clearly specify their division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as OPEN – exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement. Riders may enter only one division per class. Ribbons will be awarded 1st through 6th place. Ribbons/Awards will not be mailed . . . competitors must pick-up awards before leaving the show.
Sharps Containers:	Sharps containers will be placed in each stabling aisle. Per USEF Rule GR1210.4, Competition Management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
Confirmation of Entry:	Confirmation of entry will be e-mailed to the rider. All e-mail addresses must be clearly printed. Make sure you turn off your spam filter for Fox Village.
Definitions:	Adult Amateur (AA) = Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. USEF rule DR119.3. Only active United States Equestrian Federation members may obtain amateur status. (Exception: Equine Canada members in possession of current EC membership may sign for USEF Amateur status on a show-by-show basis at no cost). Participants must possess current USEF Amateur status and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules. If opportunity classes at Dressage Competitions are restricted to amateurs, riders are required to have an amateur status with USEF. See GR821. Junior/Young Rider (JR/YR) = Open to Junior & Young Riders only. Individuals are eligible as JR's until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as YR's from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age 21. See USEF rule DR119.3.
Late Entries:	\$50 – if received after the closing date.
Post Class Entries:	\$10 plus normal class fee – Post class entries accepted ONLY if time allows by 3:00PM the day before.
Returned Check Fee:	\$50 for checks returned due to non-negotiable funds.
Payment:	Payment is due at the time entries are submitted to show management in US funds. This competition accepts payment via a credit card on Fox Village, check (payable to DevonWood) or cash at the show. Please contact the show secretary with any questions. Online entries <u>ONLY</u> at https://entry.foxvillage.com/ with a credit card.
Entry Cancellation and Refunds:	Cancellations only in writing either by mail or e-mail prior to or on the closing date. 100% of entry fees will be refunded with veterinarian or doctor's certificate before closing date, minus the office fee. NO REFUNDS, including stall and office fees, for any reason after the OFFICIAL PUBLISHED closing date, even if the closing date is extended. Every effort will be made to refund entries via the original method of payment. SEE USEF rule GR910 for substitution of rider.
No Shows:	All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office, prior to their first ride, will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.
Ride Times:	Unofficial ride times will be posted to www.foxvillage.com after 6:00 PM on Tuesday, September 22nd. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the unofficial ride times. Please DO NOT call for your ride times. Official ride times will be posted in the show office by NOON the day before the competition starts.

Arenas/Footing:	This is an indoor show only. Four arenas: one indoor competition arena, (20M X 60M), with warm-up (20M X 40M), both EquiBase footing (sand mixed with Geotek fabric over rubber matting), and three outdoor competition arena, (20M X 60M), with warm-up (sand over rubber matting). Lungeing area is located near lower stabling. No lunging in warm-ups or round pens.

Stabling:	Permanent box stalls with full doors – Main Barn 14'x14'; Upper Barn 12'x12'; Lower barns: Barn E/F has 12'x12'; Barns C/D and G/H have 10'x10'. Three bags of mandatory bedding are required. No bedding is provided in tack stalls. Additional bedding is available for purchase on-site. Bedding other than shavings or pellets prohibited. Stalls may not be resold or sublet by exhibitors. Indicate stabling preference on entry, but realize that stalls will be assigned based on horse's size, sex, and length of stay, not just on postmark date. Stalls available starting Thursday at 9AM through Friday 6PM (or +2 hours after last scheduled ride). Early arrivals and late departures must be pre-arranged directly through show management on show entry form. Stalls are available on a first come, first serve basis by entries received by date. All horses must have a stall. No initial bedding is provided and should be included on your entry form or order from show office by 3:00 PM each day. No guarantees of same day delivery if ordered after 3:00 PM. Please specify the barn of choice on entry form. Competitors are responsible for all stall damage. ABSOLUTELY NO NAILS, SCREW EYES IN METAL OR WOOD. Every effort is made to honor stabling requests but cannot guarantee. When asking to be "stabled with" someone please designate one Name for your group in the "stable with" section of the entry form. Stall changes must be approved by the show office. Horses found in an incorrect stall may be moved and fined \$100.00. This is for safety issues. Stallion owners need to bring suitable equipment to close off the stall, if necessary, for the safety of your horse and those stabled near him. Stalls will be available after 9AM on THURSDAY. Early arrivals and late departures must be approved by show management and may be assessed additional stabling fees. SMOKING IS PROHIBITED IN STALL AREAS.
Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy:	Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents or emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. See GR.311. During inclement weather, for safety and social distancing, participants will be asked to shelter in their personal vehicles or in their tack stall. Participants will not be allowed to congregate in the concession stand or the show office.

Camper/RV Hook-up:	\$100 for Lower Barn Camper/RV Hook-up Thursday thru Friday – Camper/RV Hook-up will be assigned on a “first come, first serve” based upon receipt of entry. Available after 9AM Thursday thru 6PM on Friday. No generators are allowed on the property. Lower & Upper Barn Trailer/RV Parking have limited access to 20A and 30A power. Electrical access is available on a first-come-first-serve basis. Access to electrical hook-up is not guaranteed and is only permitted between 7pm-7am daily. For safety, all electrical cords must be stowed during competition hours. DevonWood is not responsible for theft, damage, or spoilage that occurs to any RV/LQ/vehicle or its contents.

Food:	Will be available on the show grounds during normal show hours.
Warning:	Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities.
Children, Pets, and Smoking:	Absolutely NO DOGS ALLOWED on show grounds, except registered service animals. Children (minors) must be supervised by an adult (over 18 years of age) at all times. Smoking is forbidden anywhere on the property at any time. E-Cigarettes and Vaping are also forbidden.
Protective Headgear:	Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet, which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. See USEF Rule DR121.1.
Parking:	Reserved parking is available on a first come basis for a fee. Entire rig must fit within space, both length and width, to ensure clear fire lane. Electric hookups are available as a courtesy at the end of each stabling row (first come basis) and may be used between the hours of 7PM through 7AM. Trailers and tow vehicles may park outside the main facility gates at no additional fee.

Directions:	From I-5 south from Portland/north from Salem to Sherwood/Tualatin exit, #289. West on Nyberg Road (Nyberg Road becomes Tualatin/Sherwood Hwy) and go five miles to Hwy 99W. Turn south and go three miles to 25033 SW Pacific Hwy, on your right just past Brookman/Chapman Rd.
USEF Show Pass:	Effective 12-1-2022 any rider, handler, driver, or owner are limited to one Show Pass purchase annually (December 1-November 30). A USEF Show Pass will be available for purchase by exhibitors on-line only, within 7 days of the show’s start date. Competitions will not accept payment for show pass fees and therefore this fee will not appear on the entry blank. Individuals, including parents who are signing as trainer on behalf of a minor, who are participating as a trainer or coach are not eligible for a Show Pass and must obtain a Senior Competing membership to participate in a USEF-licensed competition.
Prize Giving/Award Ceremonies:	Per USEF Rule DR123.13, “Participation in prize-giving (awards) ceremonies by placed rider/horse combinations may be mandatory and failure to participate may result in loss of prizes and prize money at the discretion of Competition Management. Specific requirements and penalties for failure to participate in prize-giving ceremonies must be announced in the prize list.” An official schedule for the Awards Ceremonies will be posted in the Show Secretary’s office by NOON on the day prior to the beginning of the competition. If the posted awards schedule is changed, all affected competitors must be notified.

Vendors:	ALL vendors, including braiders, food services, retail, etc., must have insurance if they will be on the property. A copy must be on file in the show office. Contact show management with any questions.
DSHB Classes:	USDF HID# may be required for entries in the breed show, see DR205.3. Young Horse/Dressage SH Prospect In-Hand = young horses (thru 3 years old) will be shown in-hand at the walk and trot on the triangle. Bridles are mandatory for horses 2 years and older. Young horses are judged on confirmation (30%), movement (60%) and general impression (10%). SH Champion = no charge (NC) for Sport Horse Championship classes. Breeder's Group = No more than 3 horses/any age or sex—all bred by exhibitor. Class #562 entered under breeder/farm name; one fee. Suitable to Become a Dressage Horse = Horse must be under 7 years of age & not have competed above 1st Level. Horses ridden walk, trot, canter both ways of ring. Mature Horse/USDF Dressage SH Breeding Stock In-Hand = Bridles are mandatory for horses 2 years and older. Mature horses are judged on confirmation (40%), movement (50%) and general impression (10%). Group Classes = Bridles are mandatory for horses 2 years and older. Horses are judged for confirmation (40%), movement (50%) and general impression (10%). Class #560 entered under dam name; one fee for the group. Class #560 entered under the dam name; Class #561 entered under the sire name; Class #562 entered under breeder name (as it appears on breed papers); one fee for the entire group. Under Saddle Classes = Horses are judged for confirmation (30%), movement (60%) and general impression (10%). Horses ridden at walk, trot, canter both ways of the ring.

- The owner(s) is not required to be a USDF member for qualifying or series final competition. If the owner does not have a current USDF Group, Participating or Business Membership, non-members fees will apply.
- For the Materiale Championship Final (classes 905 / 906 / 907) the rider must have a current USDF Participating Membership (PM) at the time the horse's qualifying score is earned and at the time of the finals class. All horses must either have USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) or USDF Horse Identification Number (HID). The owner(s) is not required to be a USDF member for qualifying or series final competition. If the owner does not have a current USDF Group, Participating or Business Membership, non-members fees will apply.
- At least two judges (one of whom is a licensed USEF "R" DSHB judge) will officiate in each Series Final class. Each judge will evaluate each entry independently. Scribes will be provided for each judge.
- Winners will be determined by the average of all judges' scores. The highest scoring horses will be declared champions and the second highest reserve champions.
- Horses will be shown individually on the triangle at the walk and trot and standing for conformation. Each horse will be evaluated in the same manner. Call-backs are permitted.
- **How to Qualify for the Nutrena®/USDFBCS Materiale Championship** – you can qualify for the Nutrena®/USDFBCS Materiale Championship by receiving one score of 72.000% or higher in a materiale class held at any USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized DSHB or Dressage competition during the relative competition year.

2026 Nutrena/USDF Breeders Championship Series Program Rules

The Nutrena/USDF Breeders Championship Series (Nutrena/USDFBCS) is a program intent on recognizing quality bloodlines and dressage prospects across the nation. Through a combination of in-hand and materiale classes, the Nutrena/USDFBCS provides competition opportunities for dressage prospects and breeding stock.

- The Nutrena/USDFBCS is scheduled on a calendar year basis. It starts January 1 and ends September 30.
- A series must have a minimum of two qualifying events to host a series final competition.
- Series boundaries are determined by USDF. Please be advised that the boundaries of any given series may cross the regional boundaries established for regular dressage competitions.
- All Dressage Sport Horse Breeding (DSHB) and Nutrena/USDFBCS exhibitors and management are responsible for knowing the rules for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized dressage competitions holding DSHB classes, as well as USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions in general. The USEF Rule Book Dressage Chapter, Subchapter DR-2, contains the DSHB class rules, and can be found at www.usef.org.

I. NUTRENA/USDFBCS IN-HAND CHAMPIONSHIP DIVISIONS

DSHB In-Hand classes provide evaluation of conformation and movement of horses of all ages for potential dressage horses and/or breeding stock.

A. IN-HAND CLASSES - HORSE REGISTRATION AND MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS (NUTRENA/USDFBCS QUALIFYING OR SERIES FINAL CLASSES)

CHART 1: USDF REQUIREMENTS FOR IN-HAND DIVISIONS	
HORSE	Either USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) or USDF Horse Identification Number (HID) is required for all horses entered and must be submitted. Horses registered with a breed organization should have a copy of their registration papers submitted directly to USDF. Horses participating in Nutrena/USDFBCS qualifying or series final competitions are not required to be registered with any breed registry. For registered horses the name of the breed, sire, dam, damsire, and breeder must be given on the entry blank. Horses not registered with a breed registry should be listed as "unregistered" on entry blank. For unregistered horses competing in DSHB classes, the breeding information is strongly recommended.
OWNER	Owner is not required to be a USDF member for qualifying or series final competitions. If the owner does not have a USDF Participating, Group or Business membership, then a USDF non-member fee will apply.
HANDLER/ ASSISTANT HANDLER	Neither USDF membership nor a USDF non-member fee is required for the handler.
Elimination of a horse from its relevant class or series final class may occur should any USDF non-member, membership or horse registration/HID applications with related fees fail to be paid and/or collected by show management and submitted to USDF at the completion of a competition.	

B. REQUIREMENTS FOR NUTRENA/USDFBCS IN-HAND QUALIFYING CLASSES

1. Classes must be offered and judged according to DR209.
2. Neither foals nor horses of any other age may be shown loose.
3. All qualifying competitions must offer every Sport Horse Prospect In-Hand and Breeding Stock In-Hand division of the Nutrena/USDFBCS. The divisions are:
 - a. Current Year Foal Championship
 - b. Filly Championship
 - c. Colt/Gelding Championship
 - d. Four-Year-Old Prospect Championship
 - e. Mare Championship (Breeding Stock)
 - f. Stallion Championship (Breeding Stock)

4. Only a single set of Sport Horse Prospect and Breeding Stock In-Hand DSHB qualifying classes may be offered per competition. These classes must be open to all horses and ponies of the appropriate age and sex, and not subject to any entry restriction.
5. A separate qualifier championship class must be held for all divisions, even those that have only one class or one horse in the division. All horses must be re-evaluated by the judge(s) at both the walk and the trot in the championship class per DR210. If any one of the judges adjudicating this class has not previously judged all the horses in this class, conformation must also be reevaluated on every horse.
6. Qualifier championship classes must be open to first and second place winners of their respective In-Hand qualifying classes as listed in Chart 2 below. Organizers have the option of including third placed horses in qualifier championship classes. No scores are given. Ties are not allowed. The champion and reserve champion of each division at each qualifier event are eligible to compete in their respective Nutrena/USDFBCS Final championship class. A third-place horse in each championship class must be named as well.
7. Current Year Foals ARE NOT ALLOWED in Filly Championship and Colt/Gelding Championship classes. Fillies of Current Year and Colts/Geldings of Current Year will compete in the same Current Year Foal Championship.
8. Four-Year-Old Prospect mares and Four-Year-Old Prospect stallions/geldings will compete against each other in the same Four-Year-Old Prospect Championship.
9. Mare classes may be divided by age, competition and/or breeding status (as of January 1st of the current competition year), as in the following examples:
 - a. Four-Year-Old & Older Maiden Mares
 - b. Four-Year-Old & Older Yeld Mares
 - c. Four-Year-Old & Older Broodmares
10. Stallion classes may be divided by age, competition and/or breeding status, as in the following examples:
 - a. Four-Year-Old & Older Stallions Showing Only In-Hand
 - b. Four-Year-Old & Older Stallions Showing Also Under Saddle
11. Note the following clarification on “stallion”: No geldings may compete in the Nutrena/USDFBCS classes for stallions even if they are gelded after qualifying for the finals and are breeding via frozen semen.
12. Each horse may only enter the Nutrena/USDFBCS qualifying class(es) for which it is eligible and may only qualify for the specific Nutrena/USDFBCS championship class(es) for that division(s). Four-Year Old Mares & Stallions may show in both the Four-Year Old Prospect class AND their respective Breeding Stock class.
13. Geldings of any age may NOT show in breeding stock classes/categories. Geldings, age four and under, may show ONLY in sport horse prospect classes.
14. All classes must be judged using the correct score sheet for appropriate category percentages. Sport horse prospects four years old and under MUST be evaluated on the current USDF Dressage Sport Horse Prospect In-Hand score sheets and mare and stallion breeding stock MUST be evaluated on the current USDF Dressage Sport Horse Breeding Stock score sheets.
15. During awards ceremonies, each division champion and reserve champion must be named Nutrena/USDFBCS qualifying champions and reserve champions for the show and be awarded a qualifier ribbon that is supplied to the show by USDF. Announcements must identify sponsors and horses’ breeding information. If a champion and/or reserve has already qualified for a final, the third-placed horse from the pertinent qualifying championship class will be eligible to compete in a final. Qualifying ribbons are still awarded to the champion and reserve champion, the third-place horse will not receive a qualifier ribbon.
16. Any horse receiving a 75.000% or higher in its age/sex class is eligible to compete in the Nutrena/USDFBCS Finals, independent of whether they go forward to a qualifying championship class.
17. A list of qualified horses is maintained on the USDF website.
18. All champions and reserve champions will be eligible to compete in **ANY** Nutrena/USDFBCS Final, regardless of where qualification is earned, but may compete in only **one** series final competition per calendar year.

C. CONDUCT OF SERIES FINAL IN-HAND CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

- At least two USEF DSHB judges must officiate in each series final class. Placings will be determined by the average of all judges' scores. At least one judge must be a USEF DSHB 'R' judge.
- Ties in series final classes must remain unbroken. Examples:
 - If there are two champions, there is not a reserve champion.

- b. If there are two reserve champions, the next place will be 4th place.
3. A grand champion and reserve grand champion for each division will be named at each Nutrena/USDFBCS Final event and will receive awards and prizes provided by USDF. Third, through sixth place horses will receive ribbons provided by USDF. After the last Nutrena/USDFBCS Final held in a competition year, certificates will be available from USDF via the website.
4. USDF reserves the right to change, alter, or retract any placings and/or prizes for up to 60 days after the last day of competition if an error or violation is discovered.
5. Each horse must be shown individually on the triangle at the walk and trot and stand for conformation. Callbacks are permitted only if stated in the prize list or program (DR209).
6. The owner **must enter** the qualified horse in the appropriate Nutrena/USDFBCS Final championship class. The horse is NOT automatically entered in the series final championship class because it qualified earlier in the day or at another show. Series final events must allow late entries in series final classes for horses that qualified after the official closing date.
7. Management must collect all USDF non-member, membership and/or horse registration/HID applications and related fees prior to the start of a series final class for eligible entries to compete in the class. Should the required USDF non-member, membership or horse registration/HID applications and related fees fail to be submitted to USDF following the completion of a series final competition, elimination of a horse from its series final class may result.

II. NUTRENA/USDFBCS Materiale Championship Division

DSHB Materiale classes provide evaluation of movement and rideability under saddle of three, four, and five-year olds as potential dressage riding horses.

A. MATERIALE CLASSES - HORSE REGISTRATION AND MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS (NUTRENA/USDFBCS QUALIFYING OR SERIES FINAL CLASSES)

CHART 3: USDF REQUIREMENTS FOR MATERIALE DIVISIONS	
HORSE	Either USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) or USDF Horse Identification Number (HID) is required for all horses entered and must be submitted. OWNER	Owner is not required to be a USDF member for qualifying or series final competitions. If the owner does not have a USDF Participating, Group or Business membership, then a USDF non-member fee will apply.
RIDER	Rider is required to have a current USDF Participating Membership at the time a horse's qualifying score is earned and at the time of the Nutrena/USDFBCS Materiale Championship class.
Elimination of a horse from its relevant class or series final class may occur should any USDF non-member, membership or horse registration/HID applications with related fees fail to be paid and/or collected by show management and submitted to USDF at the completion of a competition.	

B. REQUIREMENTS FOR NUTRENA/USDFBCS MATERIALE QUALIFYING CLASSES

1. Classes must be offered and judged according to DR134 & DR204 and the directives on the score sheet.
2. Dressage Competitions and DSHB Competitions may offer Materiale classes in the following categories:

- a. Three-year old Fillies Materiale
 - b. Three-year old Colts and Geldings Materiale
 - c. Four-year old Mares Materiale
 - d. Four-year old Stallions and Geldings Materiale
 - e. Five-year old Mares Materiale
 - f. Five-year old Stallions and Geldings Materiale
3. Qualifying competitions may combine age groups but not different sexes. Fillies and/or mares may not be combined in classes with colts, geldings and/or stallions except in championship materiale classes (DR204).
 4. Two numbers (min. 3" x 5") must be provided to and worn by Materiale class entries and they must be positioned on each side of the saddle pad.
 5. Scores must be awarded to all competitors competing in materiale classes.
 6. A horse may qualify to compete in a Nutrena/USDFBCS Materiale Championship Final by receiving one score of 72.000% or higher in a materiale class held at any USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized DSHB or Dressage competition during the relative competition year.
 7. Scores earned at competitions licensed by USEF as Regular or Local competitions are not eligible to be used as qualifying scores for the Nutrena/USDFBCS Materiale Championships.
 8. The Nutrena/USDFBCS Materiale Championships will run on the same calendar year as the Nutrena/USDFBCS (January 1-September 30). Qualifications to compete in a Nutrena/USDFBCS Materiale Championship class must be earned in the calendar year that the championship occurs.
 9. Qualifying scores to compete in a championship class may be earned up until the championship class occurs. Materiale scores earned at dressage competitions held after all Nutrena/USDFBCS Finals in a competition year, are not eligible as qualifying scores.
 10. A list of qualified horses is maintained on the USDF website.
 11. A horse may qualify with a different rider than the rider who competes the horse in the championship class.
 12. All qualified horses will be eligible to compete in ANY Nutrena/USDFBCS Final, regardless of where qualification is earned, but may compete in only one series final competition per calendar year.

C. CONDUCT OF SERIES FINAL MATERIALE CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES

1. At least two USEF DSHB judges must officiate in each Nutrena/USDFBCS Materiale Championship class. Placings will be determined by the average of all judges' scores. At least one judge must be a USEF DSHB 'R' judge.
2. Series final events must hold materiale classes allowing for qualification opportunities prior to holding the Nutrena/USDFBCS Materiale Championship classes.
3. **Two** numbers (min. 3" x 5") must be provided to and worn by Materiale class entries and they must be positioned on each side of the saddle pad.
4. Scores must be awarded to all competitors.
5. Ties in Nutrena/USDFBCS Materiale Championship classes must remain unbroken.
6. Materiale Championships will be held at each Nutrena/USDFBCS Final competition. All qualified horses regardless of sex will compete against one another in their respective age groups. Each Nutrena/USDFBCS Final will hold the following divisions:
 - a. Three-year old Fillies, Colts and Geldings Materiale
 - b. Four-Year-Old Mares, Stallions and Geldings Materiale
 - c. Five-Year-Old Mares, Stallions and Geldings Materiale
7. Horses will be evaluated according to the criteria listed on the current "USDF Materiale Class" score sheet, and classes must be conducted according to the current USDF "Procedures to Host USDF Materiale Classes".
8. A grand champion and reserve grand champion for each division will be named at each Nutrena/USDFBCS final event and will receive awards and prizes provided by USDF. Third, through sixth place horses will receive ribbons provided by USDF. After the last Nutrena/USDFBCS Final held in a competition year, certificates will be available from USDF via the website.
9. USDF reserves the right to change, alter, or retract any placings and/or prizes for up to 60 days after the last day of the championship if an error or violation is discovered.
10. Owner must enter the qualified horse in the horse's appropriate Nutrena/USDFBCS Materiale Championship class prior to commencement of the class. The horse is NOT automatically entered in the class because the horse qualified

earlier in the day or at another show. Nutrena/USDFBCS Final events must agree to allow late entries in the Nutrena/USDFBCS Materiale Championship classes for horses that qualified for the championship after the official closing date.

11. Management must collect all USDF non-member, membership and/or horse registration/HID applications and related fees prior to the start of a series final class for eligible entries to compete in the class. Should the required USDF non-member, membership or horse registration/HID applications and related fees fail to be submitted to USDF following the completion of a series final competition, elimination of a horse from its series final class may result.

III. NUTRENA/USDFBCS FINALS PROSPECT AWARDS

At each Nutrena/USDFBCS Final, a Three-Year-Old Prospect Award and a Four-Year-Old Prospect Award will be presented to the Three-Year-Old and Four-Year-Old horses earning the highest combined scores from their respective in-hand and materiale series final championship classes. USDF will provide each Nutrena/USDFBCS Finals with the prizes for the Three-Year-Old Prospect and Four-Year-Old Prospect Awards that must be presented to the winners at each competition.

MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

GR901.9: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; and 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT

GR1301.7-8: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Other Rules & Specifications

USEF rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the show grounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire. Visit the USEF website for the most current rulebook, www.usef.org.

Safe Sport Statement: Effective immediately, any competition with the start date of September 1, 2020 and later will be required to include the following Safe Sport statement in the Rules and Regulation section of the prize list: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. See www.usef.org for more information.

Bridle Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is out their stall either being exercised or ridden.

Liability – Horses by their inherent nature present a risk. This show, the management, the USEF Licensee, and the facility will not be responsible for any loss or damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed, or in any way injured. All horses exhibited in this show participate entirely at the owner's risk. Neither the Organizing Committee, show volunteers and staff, the facility or its owners, any host GMO, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

Additionally, Majestic Farm and their officials, sponsors and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss, which may occur to any exhibitor, spectators, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at any of the competition.

NON-U.S. CITIZENS (AS DEFINED BY GR901.9) AND FOREIGN COMPETITORS (AS DEFINED BY GR828.4): must provide proof, in English, of current membership in good standing in their respective National Federation, or hold current membership in good standing with the USEF.

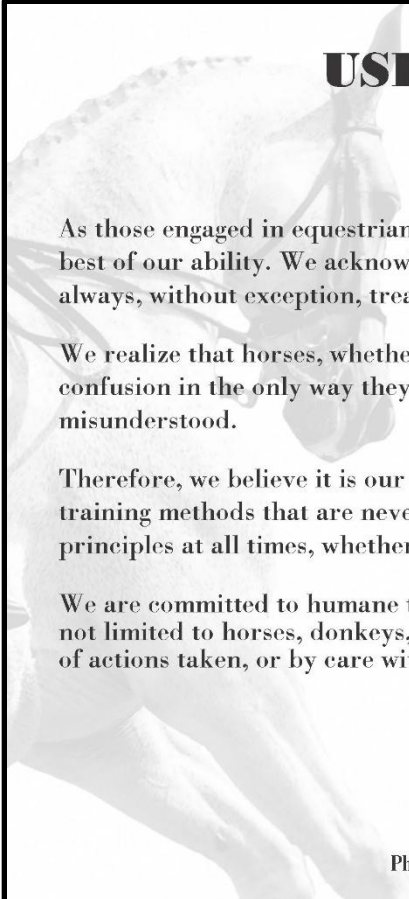
A *trainer* is defined as any adult who has responsibility for the horse on the competition grounds and must sign the entry form. See USEF GR148.

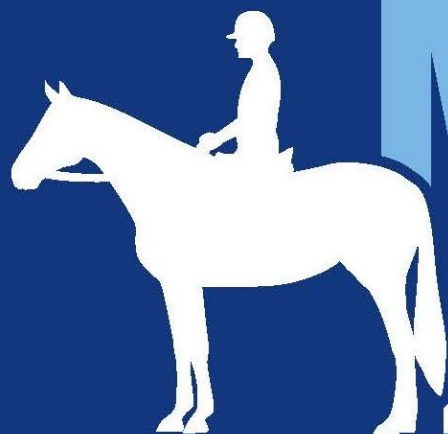

USEF Equine Vaccination Rule

From the USEF Communications Department

Lexington, Ky. - In January, the USEF Board of Directors approved an addition to the rule book, which outlines equine vaccination requirements at licensed competitions. Beginning December 1, 2015, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation-licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables.

Due to several high profile Equine Herpes (EHV) outbreaks in recent years that have involved the neuropathic strain of the virus (equine herpesvirus myeloencephalopathy-EHM), some competitions have placed vaccination requirements on their competitors that go beyond most accepted medical opinions and raise concern that unnecessary requirements can potentially put a horse at risk. The intent of this rule is to ensure that all licensed competitions comply with the vaccination guidelines for Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes (Rhinopneumonitis) published by the American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP). These guidelines are reviewed by infectious disease experts regularly, and recommend vaccinating competition horses at six-month intervals for both equine influenza (flu) and rhinopneumonitis (EHV-1 and EHV-4). There is not a vaccine that protects against EHM.

Intended to promote proper vaccination protocols, this rule does not anticipate an increased workload for competition management. The flu vaccination information can be added to the documentation already required by most competitions: a horse's health certificate and a negative coggins test.

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF INHERENT RISKS: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with equine activities, including but not limited to horseback riding and equestrian sport, are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").
