As we've seen over the past few years, both human and equine diseases are ongoing forces that continue to impact our sport. With that said, we've done our best to disseminate as many of our show's logistical plans as possible so that *you* can continue to make the right decisions for both athletes – human and equine.

This Prize List holds the framework of a competition given "best case" circumstances. It is with almost near certainty that state, local, and/or federal public health policy and/or state agricultural authorities will limit our ability to host this show as this Prize List suggests. You have our commitment as hosts of <u>your</u> Regional Championships, to communicate with you readily and keep you apprised of developments and changes so that you can make the right choice as to whether to compete in this competition or not. Award Ceremony Schedule

A tentative schedule for the Awards Ceremonies will be printed in the "Show Program" and the official schedule will be posted in the Show Secretary's Office by NOON on the day prior to the beginning of the competition and in an area where social distancing can be adhered to.

Prize Money, Awards, Details and Distribution

- Prize money for Great American/USDF Regional Championships will be paid directly by the USDF office to the recorded horse owner within thirty (30) days of the last day of each championship.
- Prize money for each Regional Championship class: Champion **\$476** / Reserve Champion **\$317**. Awards will also be provided to each Champion and Reserve Champion.
- DSM (Dressage Seat medal) Semi-Final Awards: USDF will award ribbons to the top eight riders, and an engraved silver tray to the Champion and Reserve Champion. The Champion and Reserve Champion will also be invited to participate in the 2026 USEF Dressage Seat Medal Finals.
- USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class: Neck Sashes are awarded through eighth place. Champions will receive a \$100 gift certificate from Big Dees Tack and Vet Supply and an engraved silver tray, Reserve Champions a \$75 gift certificate and an engraved silver tray, third place finishers a \$50 gift certificate, and fourth place finishers a \$25 gift certificate.

Open Show (Non-GAIG/USDF Championship)

Awards & Details

- First place in all non-GAIG/USDF Regional Championship classes with three or more competitors in a division will receive a prize.
- Ribbons 1st 3rd place, pinned by rider division for all non-GAIG/USDF Regional Championships.
- Ribbons(s) and Prize(s) can be picked up at the Awards Office by the exhibitor or designated adult with legible signature required. All test sheets will be delivered to your Equestrian-Hub Dashboard.

COMPETITION RULES (GENERAL)

CLASSES

- "Q" Denotes Qualifying Class for 2026 GAIG/USDF Regional Championships.
- In test of choice classes, you must ride the highest test of the level if wanting as a Qualifying ride.
- \$20 qualifying fee must be paid before the beginning of the class and is non-refundable.
- Open classes may be split if entries warrant. Will be Pinned by Division. There is no guarantee that an open class will be scheduled before the championship classes of that day.
- Open classes are filled in postmarked order.
- To accommodate all eligible championship rides, Open classes may be cancelled.
- This schedule is tentative. Championship classes may be scheduled, if necessary, on days different to those indicated above.
- Whips may NOT be carried in any Championship class
- All championship classes must be ridden from memory (no caller).

Riders placing in Great American/USDF Regional Championship classes must be present, mounted and in full riding attire for awards ceremonies (eight places for all Championship classes). Attendance to award ceremonies is **not mandatory**, but riders should let show management know if they are not attending.

Musical Freestyles

- Competitors are encouraged to upload their music to their Equestrian Hub Dashboard electronically. CDs are strongly discouraged.
- A CD or MP3 files must be given to the show office the day before the freestyle class.
- Please LABEL the CD/File with exhibitor name and number, horse name and class number/level.
- Sound checks times will be posted at the show office on day prior to your ride time.
- Sound Checks are MANDATORY.
- Competitors are responsible for picking up their music before the end of the show. Unclaimed CD's will not be returned or mailed.

Foreign Competitors

- Show management strongly advises Foreign Competitors to review USEF GR 828.4
- Foreign Competitors who desire to compete in non-breed restricted, National Competitions in the FEI recognized disciplines in the United States must have proof, in English, of membership in good standing from their National Federation or must be members in good standing of the United States Equestrian Federation. (USEF GR828.4.a)
- Competition management must request proof, in English, of current membership in good standing from their respective National Federation, or proof of current Federation membership. (USEF GR828.4.b)

Classes

- If entering Adult Amateur classes, USEF card must declare amateur status.
- Specify test in Test of Choice (TOC) classes. If the test number and/or FEI description is not
 indicated on the entry, the test assigned will be the highest test of the level. A horse may enter
 each Test of Choice class only once.
- Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications for the current federation rulebook will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or reorder classes, add or substitute judges or make any other changes required.

Protective Headgear – DR120.1.1

Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet, which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place.

FEI Pony / Pony Measurement

If ponies are entered in FEI Pony Test(s) classes and in need of a USEF measurement card, an appointment for measuring MUST be made with show management <u>a minimum of one week prior</u> to the first competition date of the show. Owners must notify show management of any ponies needing measurement, so a time can be arranged for this service. Management will pro-rate the fee charged by the veterinarian among the pony owners. This fee will be the actual charge by the veterinarian and due upon vet visit. Owner will pay veterinarian directly for this service.

Veterinary Health Requirements

No horse will be permitted on the grounds without the following:

- Negative Coggins/EIA (within 12mo) & Proof of Vaccinations (per USEF GR844) Equine Influenza Virus & Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within 6mo prior to competition.
- \circ Out-of-State competitors must provide a Health Certificate.
- NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN IF RIGHT TO COMPETE IS DENIED BECAUSE VACCINATION DOCUMENTATION IS MISSING OR INCOMPLETE.

Download the <u>US Equestrian Vaccination Record</u> form and bring completed, signed document(s) to the competition with the horse. It is your responsibility to ensure that your vaccination

documentation has been completed before sending to the Show Secretary. Please review GR844 so that you fully understand what you – as a competitor – are required to provide.

Other Terms & Requirements

- USEF rules require that competitors must request permission of the show secretary when removing their horse from the show facility prior to the end of the show.
- No horse may compete in more than two successive levels at any one recognized show.
- Only one rider per horse in any one class.
- Lateness will result in elimination.
- All horses on grounds must wear a bridle number while out of stall.

Entry Rules, Policies & Terms

- No fax, email or phone entries accepted.
- All fees are to be remitted in US funds only (USD).
- Include all required, current, legible horse/rider/owner/trainer/coach documentation with entry.
- All entries must be signed. Mandatory: Owner, Rider, Trainer. Coach only if applicable
- Minors MUST have their parent or legal guardian signatures, as well as their own signature.
- Any entry received without all required information, documentation, required signatures, will incur
- additional fees and will be subject to the non-refundable Document Search Fee of \$20.00 per entry.
- Signature Fee of \$25.00 per entry will be assessed for any entry that is submitted without required signatures attached in original submission.
- Entries will not be accepted without full payment of fees. Credit cards may be accepted. Entries using a credit card shall have a convenience fee of 3.0 percent. Convenience fee shall only be charged once for the show entry. Receipt for convenience fee to be provided when charged.
- Electronic Entries with unpaid fees will be considered the same as a returned or NSF check.
- Entries must be submitted to Equestrian-Hub, or US Postmarked by the closing date. Mailed entries must be received by the date on the prize list header.
- Late entries for GAIG/USDF Championship accepted on a space-available basis.
- Late entries for Open Classes accepted on a space available basis.
- Each entry change requested in writing, and granted by show secretary, after closing date is subject to \$25.00 fee per change.
- Confirmation of entry will be emailed to the email addresses legibly listed on the entry blank.
- Entry discrepancies must be rectified within 24 hours of emailed confirmation being sent.
- Management reserves the right to limit the number of horses a rider may enter in the same open class(es).
- Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident or emergency.
- Management reserves the right to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by show management.

Post Entries at Show

Will be taken as scheduling permits, class fee plus \$25.00 (must request by NOON the day prior).

Cancellation & Refund Policy

- Only fees paid directly to DevonWood Equestrian Centre, LLC (non-Federation fees) will be considered for refund by DevonWood Equestrian Centre, LLC. No credit card processing fees are eligible for refund.
- Cancellation of entries shall be by dated, written notification to the Show Secretary by email. Messages sent via social media or SMS/Text Message are not acceptable communications.
- PRIOR TO SEPTEMBER 8, 2025: Entry refunded less the Office Fee and Equestrian-Hub convenience fees.
- <u>SEPTEMBER 8-22, 2025</u>: Scratches during this period must be accompanied by a letter, on official letterhead, from an accredited **DVM** or **MD** stating that equine and/or human athlete are not fit to compete inclusive of competition dates. <u>Letter must accompany each scratch</u> <u>request</u> within the date range specified. Eligible requests will be reimbursed 50% of entry fees less office fee and document verification fees, if applied. Incomplete or unverified scratch requests will be rejected and will receive zero refund.
- <u>AFTER SEPTEMBER 22, 2025</u>: No refunds for any reason, including inclement weather or other acts of God.

- Refunds will be issued to the **OWNER** within 30 days of the final day of the competition, regardless
 of the original person that remitted payment on account.
- Refund checks expire 60 days after issuance, e.g. must be cashed no later than December 5, 2025.
- Checks not cashed by that date are null and void, and all funds on those checks revert to DevonWood Equestrian Centre, LLC.
- The competitor is responsible for reporting/requesting cancellation to DevonWood Equestrian Centre, LLC.

FACILITY INFORMATION

Arenas & Footing

Four arenas: one indoor competition arena, (20M X 60M), with warm-up (20M X 40M), both Equi-Base footing (sand mixed with Geotek fabric over rubber matting), and three outdoor competition arena, (20M X 60M), with warm-up (sand over rubber matting).

Lungeing area is located near lower stabling. No lunging in warm-ups or round pens.

Per USEF DR126.2.f.5, the Gate at A **will not be closed** during this championship competition.

Children, Pets, and Smoking

Absolutely **NO DOGS ALLOWED** on show grounds, except registered service animals. Children (minors) must be supervised by an adult (over 18 years of age) at all times. Smoking is forbidden anywhere on the property at any time. E-Cigarettes and Vaping are also forbidden.

Food

Food/drink concessions will be available on show grounds with services by DevonWood Cafe.

Parking

Reserved parking is available on a first come basis for a fee. Entire rig must fit within space, both length and width, to ensure clear fire lane. Electric hookups are available as a courtesy at the end of each stabling row (first come basis) and may be used between the hours of 7 pm through 7 am. Trailers and tow vehicles may park outside the main facility gates at no additional fee.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

A. MEMBERSHIP/REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS FOR QUALIFYING AND CHAMPIONSHIPS Rider:

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
- A horse is not required to have breed registry papers
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

B. QUALIFYING CLASS AND CHAMPIONSHIP ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Having won a USEF/USDF Regional Championships three times (in any region over their lifetime), a horse/rider combination may no longer compete in USEF/USDF Regional Championship competition at that or a lower level (Grand Prix excepted), if they received the minimum qualifying score or higher for that division and level in the championship test per USEF DR127.5.
- 2. A horse may not be entered in more than one USEF/USDF Regional Championship at a particular level in the same calendar year.
- USDF will presume qualified horse/rider combinations will 3 compete in the region in which the rider resides as determined by the address associated with the rider's membership information on file as of July 1. Riders are NOT required to be a resident of the region to compete in that region's championship. Riders who wish to compete at Regional Championships in a region other than their region of residence, must submit a Change of Region Form. This form must be submitted with a \$40 fee prior to July 1. Change of Region Forms may be accepted from July 2 up to August 1, with a

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fee of \$100; from August 2, up to the closing date of the championship region the rider is declaring for, with a fee of \$300. No changes of region may be made after the closing date of the region in which a rider wishes to enter, for any reason. In addition, all persons living outside of the United States, who intend to compete in a Regional Championship, must submit a Change of Region form and applicable fee to USDF to declare a region.

- A rider may not compete in more than one Regional Championship 4. competition in the same calendar year.
- In the event a competitor is unable to produce copies of the USDF membership or lifetime horse registration documents required to enter a qualifying class, a USDF competition affidavit with appropriate fee may be completed and filed with the competition secretary. The affidavit and appropriate fee must be submitted to USDF by the competition secretary. Copies of the required memberships and registrations MUST be included with the championship entry. Affidavits will not be accepted for USEF or USDF membership or horse recording verification purposes for entry in championship classes.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

E. CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

- All Regional Championship competitions are considered Level 4. Please refer to USEF Dressage Level Requirements for specifics.
- 2. Each entry must designate the division being entered (open, adult amateur or junior/young rider) and must meet minimum percentage requirements for the championship division entered.
- Cross entering open and junior/young rider divisions or open and 3. adult amateur divisions for a horse/rider combination is permitted at adjacent levels. It is not permitted at the same level. Exception: freestyle or equivalent FEI Junior or FEI Young Rider levels.
- 4. If a rider intends to enter a Regional Championship as an adult amateur, the rider must be an adult by the current USEF definition (DR 119.3) and a current amateur by the USEF definition. (USEF GR1306, 1307)
- If a rider intends to enter a championship as a junior/young rider, the rider must be a junior/young rider by the current USEF definition and her/his birth date must be on file with USDF by July 1 of the championship year.
- Verification of USDF/USEF membership cards and horse 6. recording and registration certificates must accompany championship entry (USDF PM for rider, USDF PM or BM for owner, etc.)
- 7. Under penalty of elimination, whips may not be carried in championship tests (Exception: Competitors riding sidesaddle may carry a whip no longer than 47.2 inches (120 cm), including lash, in USEF/USDF Championships.) An adjustable-length whip may not be carried by a mounted rider.
- 8. Under penalty of elimination, all championship tests must be ridden from memory. (USEF DR122.1)

- 9. The gate at "A" may be left open for every USEF/USDF championship ride. Decisions to either close the gate or leave it open must be consistent for all championship classes. Each Regional Championship competition management must publish in its official prize list if the gate will be closed in championship classes. (USEF DR126.2.f.5)
- 10. Under penalty of disqualification from all championship classes for the horse/rider combination, within 24 hours prior and at no time during a USEF/USDF Regional Championship competition may any horse entered in that Championship competition be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered in the Championship competition on that horse (exception: grooms riding on loose rein). Further, any horse entered in a championship competition, even entered at two levels, must be ridden by the same rider throughout competition. (USEF DR127.6) (NOTE: This applies throughout the entire competition, even after a horse has completed its championship classes.)
- 11. In the event of a tie (equality of total points) for champion and/or reserve champion in USEF/USDF championship classes, the collective marks after coefficients have been applied will determine first, second, and/or third or all three places; (i.e. when a tie for first place is broken by collective marks, tied competitors will receive first and second places, etc.). If collective marks are equal, the tie will remain unbroken (i.e. two first places will be awarded next third place, etc.). For ties in freestyle classes refer to USEF DR129.5 which states the highest score shall be declared the winner of the class. In the case of a tie, the higher artistic score shall determine the winner. Should the artistic mark be the same, the higher mark for harmony will decide. If still tied the higher mark for choreography will decide. Ties (equality of total points and total collective marks after coefficients have been applied) after second place will be broken by collective marks. Ties (equality of total points and total collective marks after coefficients have been applied) occurring in third through eight places will remain unbroken. In the case of a tie (equality of total points and total collective marks after coefficients have been applied) for champion, prize money designated for champion and reserve champion will be combined and divided equally between the two competitors.
- Hors de Concours entries are not permitted in USEF/USDF championship classes. (USEF DR119.5)
- 13. In a USEF/USDF championship class, the horse/rider combination must obtain the necessary minimum percentage score to be named champion or reserve champion. (USEF DR123.7) If the highest placed horse/rider combination receives less than the minimum percentage, no championship awards or prize money will be issued, however an awards ceremony will be held for the entire class. In lieu of a champion and/or reserve neck sash, a first and/or second place ribbon will be awarded.
- 14. In USEF/USDF championship classes, a steward must be appointed to check the saddlery, bits and spurs, on both sides of each horse immediately after it has completed its test and has left the arena. Any discrepancy to the saddlery rules will result in immediate elimination. (USEF DR126.2.i.6)
- 15. A Registered (R) Dressage Technical Delegate (TD), who is a current Participating Member of USDF, is required to officiate at USEF/USDF championships. TDs for competitions offering qualifying and/or championship classes must investigate incidents of non-compliance and report violations to USEF. "R" Dressage TDs hired to officiate Regional Championship classes

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must be selected from outside the region. This applies only to the primary competition TD, who is the person responsible for filing the TD report for the competition with USEF. (See section H.3. c, and USEF GR1018.3 and DR127.3)

- 16. Entries in USEF/USDF dressage championship classes are limited to competitors who have met the qualifications, membership, horse recording and registration requirements, and deadlines outlined in USEF DR127 and published by USDF. Competitors who are properly qualified, whose completed entries are received by the closing date for a particular Regional Championship, and who have complied with all championship rules may not be denied entry into the Regional Championship classes for which they have qualified. Only one class per division and/or level may be held to determine USEF/USDF regional champions. (USEF DR127.7)
- USEF/USDF championships classes may not be split. (USEF DR126.2a.4)
- 18. Championship classes for juniors and young riders must only be held on Friday, Saturday, and/or Sunday. Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals classes must be held on Saturday or Sunday. Juniors and young riders' entries (horse/rider combinations) are limited to entry in only two championship classes, excluding freestyle.
- 19. Except for freestyles, the FEI Junior Team Test, and FEI Young Rider Team test, championship classes at consecutive levels, for the same division, may not be held on the same day.
- 20. Ribbons and prizes can be distributed prior to the arrival at the awards ceremony. Award ceremony attendance is not mandatory. Riders should let show management know if they plan not to attend.
- 21. All horses competing in Regional Championships classes must be stabled on the competition grounds and must remain on the grounds for the duration of their participation in the event, from the time of arrival until the horse has finished competing in all classes. If the horse has been found to have left the grounds, and returned, it would be eliminated from championship classes, but not in non-championship classes. (USEF DR127.8)
- 22. For USEF/USDF freestyle championship classes, the competitor must provide the show with music for the freestyle. Acceptable formats/methods must be specified in the prize list. Formats must include CDs and/or digital files (MP3 and/or WAV.). Only one freestyle music per CD or digital file. All music must be submitted in the time frame specified in the prize list. Video files (MP4 or .mov) will not be accepted. Digital files must be sent and received electronically or on a thumb drive. Music should not be played via a competitor's cell phone, iPad, or any other personal mobile device. The competitor is required to bring a back-up copy (thumb drive or CD) with them to the competition. See also H.7.
- 23. The test ridden for national level USEF/USDF championship classes will be the highest test of the level.
- Great American/USDF Regional Championship competitions will be required to hold USEF/NAYC Junior/Young Rider Qualifying Classes in the non-championship portion of the show. These classes are listed below. •
 - FEI Junior Team Test
 - FEI Junior Individual Test
 - FEI Junior Freestyle Test
 - FEI Young Rider Team Test
 - FEI Young Rider Individual Test
 - FEI Young Rider Freestyle Test





A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at <u>www.usdf.org</u>. Please refer to the 2026 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). 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The US Dressage Finals is an Invitational competition using the USEF/USDF Regional Championship program to qualify. Qualifying takes place at each of the nine Great American/USDF Regional Dressage Championships, based on either 1) Ranking in a Regional Championship Class or 2) Wild Card Eligibility. Either must be achieved at a Regional Championship in a class and eligible division offered at the US Dressage Finals.

I. Qualification Based on Ranking in a Regional Championship Class:

Champion and Reserve Champion horse/rider combinations for each level and eligible division from each of the nine Regional Championships will be automatically invited, provided the following three requirements are met: US Citizenship; Declaration of Intent completed by the deadline; and earning an eligible ranking in a Regional Championship class.

Freestyle classes at Regional Championships have two different classes per level, Open/Junior/Young Rider and Adult Amateur. The top two declared horse/rider combinations from the Open/Jr/YR Freestyle class and the top two declared Adult Amateur horse/rider combinations from the AA Freestyle class for each level from each of the nine Regional Championships will be automatically invited.

To be eligible for the Adult Amateur division in the Freestyles at the US Dressage Finals, competitors must check the AA box on the Regional Championship entry form and must provide proof of Adult Amateur status prior to competing in their Regional Championship classes.

- 1) <u>United States Citizenship Requirement:</u> To compete in any US Dressage Finals class, the rider must be a US citizen.
- 2) <u>Declaration Requirement:</u> The horse/rider combination must declare their intention to participate by completing the Declaration of Intent form by midnight on the day prior to the first day of their Regional Championship competition (including any open class day before the start of championship classes). There is no fee to declare, but horse/rider combinations must declare at the level(s) and eligible division(s) they intend to compete in at the US Dressage Finals. Go to <u>www.usdressagefinals.com</u> to declare.
- 3) <u>Ranking in a Regional Championship Class:</u> Eligibility to enter US Dressage Finals classes is based on a horse/rider combination's ranking in a Regional Championship class. Champions and Reserve Champions in eligible classes will be automatically invited, as long as they have declared by the deadline. *Note: In order to be named Champion and Reserve Champion in a Regional Championship class, a horse/rider combination must have achieved a score of 57% or higher.*

In the event that the Champion and/or Reserve Champion declines the invitation, or are ineligible to compete in the US Dressage Finals, the horse/rider combination that has the next highest ranking in the class will be eligible, providing they:

- 1. Are a US citizen.
- 2. Completed the Declaration of Intent for that particular level and division by the deadline.
- 3. Achieved the pre-requisite score of 57% or higher.

If that combination declines, the same process will be followed down through the fifth ranked declared horse/rider combination for that Finals level and division.

No notifications will be issued beyond the fifth ranked, of declared horse/rider combination except as may be eligible through the Wild Card invitations described below.

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II. Qualification Based on Wild Card Eligibility:

Horse/rider combinations who are not otherwise qualified to compete in the US Dressage Finals based on their Regional Championship ranking (see above) may be invited to participate in a Finals class by earning a Wild Card score achieved at one of the nine Regional Championships, provided the following two requirements are met: US Citizenship and earning an eligible Wild Card score in a Regional Championship class.

- 1) <u>United States Citizenship Requirement:</u> To compete in any US Dressage Finals class, the rider must be a US citizen.
- 2) <u>Eligible Wild Card Score</u>: Eligibility to enter US Dressage Finals classes is based on a Wild Card score earned in a Regional Championship class. For all levels and divisions from Training through Grand Prix, a horse/rider combination that competes in a Regional Championship class and achieves a score at or above the score listed below for that level and division may compete in the same level and division at the US Dressage Finals.

Note: Horse/rider combinations are not required to have filed a "Declaration of Intent" in order to receive a Wild Card invitation.

III. Invitations:

Invitations and notifications will be emailed to eligible/qualified horse/rider combinations immediately after each Regional Championship. There will be three categories of emails:

- 1) Invitation emails will be sent to the top two of the top five declared horse/rider combinations.
- 2) Invitation emails will be sent to combinations eligible for a Wild Card.
- 3) Notification emails will be sent to the third to fifth declared horse/rider combinations, notifying them that they are on the reserve/alternate list and reminding them to check the website for any status changes that would make them eligible for an invitation.

In the event that an invited horse/rider combination scratches, invitations may be issued up to the start of the competition.

Note: Competitors do not need to receive an actual invitation to nominate themselves for the US Dressage Finals. The entry system will have their eligibility status and they can nominate prior to receiving an email invitation.

IV. Nomination Requirement:

Nomination, including payment of the nomination fee, is *required* for participation in US Dressage Finals classes, *whether qualifying through ranking in a Regional Championship class or by Wild Card Eligibility.* The nomination deadline is midnight on Friday after the last championship day in the regional championship show in which the horse/rider combination competed. Each US Dressage Finals horse/rider combination is required to complete the nomination (preliminary entry) process including the horse/rider combinations on the reserve/alternate list. The Nomination fee paid will be applied to the total amount due at Closing Date.

V. Entry Requirements

Completed entries for the US Dressage Finals *must be received* by the closing date, Saturday, October 11th midnight Eastern Time. Priority for all stabling requests (including stabling in Alltech Barns and for double stalls) will be based on the date of receipt of the COMPLETE online entry. Each online entry must include the following: full payment, fully signed 2025 US Dressage Finals entry form and signed USEF Waiver, current negative Coggins test and current Flu/Rhino Vaccine Record. All documents must be uploaded when you receive your online entry confirmation from Horseshowoffice.com, that is emailed immediately to you after you enter online.

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<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Member Guide or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
